Appendix A — Proposed Charter Amendment (for vote)

The following language is proposed for addition to the UMC Charter to establish a defined process for amending the Charter. It is presented here as drafted by the Executive Committee and is subject to amendment from the floor.

Modifications to this Charter can be proposed by any member, officer, or committee at any time for consideration by the Council. Approval requires a simple majority of members participating in the vote, preferably conducted during a regular meeting of the UMC. The mechanics of such a vote (e.g., show of hands, electronic ballot, other) are at the discretion of the Chair of the meeting. If deemed necessary for expediency by the Executive Committee, votes can be conducted outside of regular meetings of the Council (e.g., via email or electronic form). In such cases, members must have a minimum of one week to submit their votes. A simple majority of votes cast by members is required for approval.
